#1.	Read the passage:			
Script (Set up for In Revelation 21:	the verse): 8 God gives us a list of who is going to Hell. Notice What He says (Read the verse)

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#2. Reveal the truth:

Explanation:

That's a bad list of sins, right? "[M]urderers, whoremongers, sorcerers, idolaters" those all seem like pretty bad sins! But notice at the end of this list God adds this sin that we've all committed – and "all liars." I'm going to ask you a question, and I want you to be honest with me, okay: Have you ever told a lie before? We all have, right? The Bible says, "let God be true, but every man a liar" (Romans 3:4). The point that God is trying to make, when he adds this sin that we've all committed at the end of list of sins that will send you to Hell, is that there "is none righteous, no, not one" (Romans 3:10) and that we're "all" sinners (Romans 3:23) and our sin has condemned us to Hell! Even if the only sin you have ever committed is telling a lie – that's enough to send you to Hell!

#3. Review the concept:

Question:

Do you see how any sin (even telling a lie) is enough to send someone to Hell?

Script (Set up for the verse):

James 2:10 puts it all together. (Read the verse)

James 2:10:

For whosoever shall keep the whole law, and yet offend in one point, he is guilty of all.

#2. Reveal the truth:

Explanation:

Here we see a hypothetical. If you were able to keep the "whole law" and only "offend in one point" break God's law one time, tell one lie, and make one mistake – the Bible says that you are guilty of all.
